


Writing skills practice: A postcard from New York – writing practice

Write a postcard to a friend or family member. Think about these questions:

Who will you write to? What's their address? Where are you? Are you having a good time? Where have you been and what have you seen? What haven't you done yet? What's the weather like? What are you going to do tomorrow?



The form is a large rectangle representing a postcard. It is divided into three main sections:
