

Prepositions

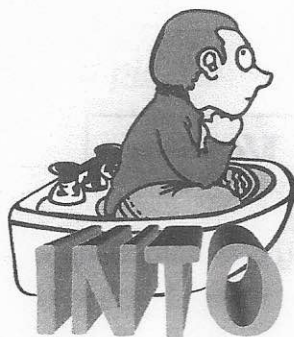
Prepositions show what's under what, who's next to who, what's where and what's when. My, that didn't sound in the least bit confusing... Read on, and all will be made crystal clear.

Prepositions are words and phrases like 'under', 'in front of', 'between' and 'with'. They tell you the relation between nouns or pronouns.

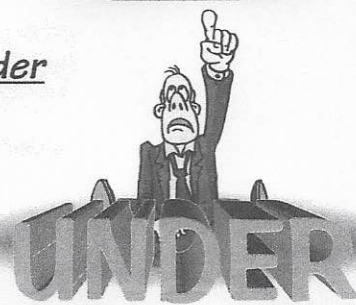


Brian stepped on the sandwich.
